- **Avoidanc**e is often driven by: Lack of understanding; Fear of change; Deficiency of technical skills. These people reject anything new and like to stick to what they know.
- Augmentation is using what is available to our benefit. Ethical AI sees gains in augmentation: How can AI reduce the burden of repetitive tasks? How can AI capitalize on the experience and expertise of your workforce? How can AI make work more fulfilling and meaningful?
- Acceleration is getting involved in the politics and policy surrounding AI and becoming an architecture of the platform, not just using it but forming it.

- Test verify any citations, Bible verses, and links to make sure they are correct
- Validate don't just copy, understand the output and use it wisely

- We should be <u>mindful about personal data</u> and data generated by daily activity should be shielded from AI systems.
- We should <u>learn how AI is used</u> and develop the skills to utilize Ai as well as being able recognize when AI is being used.
- We should be <u>actively involved in the discussion</u> and process by government of data gathering, monitoring, and protection measures.
- We should be people of <u>high integrity</u> only using AI as a tool.
